



Frequently Asked Questions

Which schools send students to Prosser?

Students from Clark, Crawford, Floyd, Harrison, Scott, and Washington counties can attend Prosser. Students enrolled in public, private, parochial, charter, and home school are all eligible to participate in Prosser.

How many students are enrolled in Prosser programs?

Prosser boasts an average enrollment of approximately 1,400 students. Prosser is the largest secondary career center in Indiana.

I am planning to go to college, so why would I attend Prosser?

Prosser and College is not an “either/or” choice. If a Prosser program is related to a student’s career goal, it will benefit that student to enroll in Prosser. Most all Prosser programs offer dual college credit opportunities. Each year, Prosser students earn 1,000’s of college credits and 100’s of industry recognized certifications.

Can I attend Prosser and still earn an honors diploma?

Absolutely! Appropriate planning of a student’s four-year high school schedule can allow a student to attend Prosser and earn a Technical Honors Diploma and/or Academic Honors Diploma.

How old do I have to be to enroll in Prosser?

Students need to be at least a junior in high school.

How much of my school day will be spent at Prosser?

Approximately one half of the school day will be at Prosser and the other half will be at the home high school. Students enrolled in the morning session will begin at 7:55 and dismiss at 10:35. Students enrolled in the afternoon session will begin at 11:25 and dismiss at 2:00. Generally, first-year students attend in the morning and second-year students attend in the afternoon.

Is it possible for me to attend Prosser my senior year only?

Yes! While most all programs offer two years of career and technical education training, it is not a requirement to attend both years. It is very beneficial for senior students to complete the first year curriculum of any Prosser program.

How many high school credits will I earn by completing a Prosser program?

Students have opportunity to earn 3 high school credits each semester.

How do Prosser students get to and from Prosser each day?

All schools provide bus transportation to and from regularly scheduled Prosser programs. Each sending school determines whether their students are allowed to drive to and from Prosser. A few Prosser programs operate on a non-traditional daily schedule. Depending on the sending school, these programs might require personal transportation.

Are students charged tuition to attend Prosser?

No! There is no tuition charge for attending Prosser. Though there is no tuition charge, most programs require minimal lab fees. These fees will provide students the appropriate consumable materials and supplies associated with the career training program. Required fees should not prevent any student from attending Prosser. Concerned families should contact Prosser’s Bookkeeper to discuss low-stress payment options.

I have been approved for textbook assistance at my high school. Do I need to also apply at Prosser?

No. Simply provide Prosser a copy of your approved form.

How do I enroll in a Prosser program?

Fill out a Prosser *intent-to-enroll* form and submit it to your school counselor. Prosser *intent-to-enroll* forms can be found on the Prosser website or in your school counselor’s office.
