Business Partnership **Clarksville Fire Department**

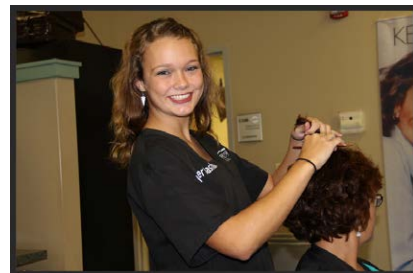

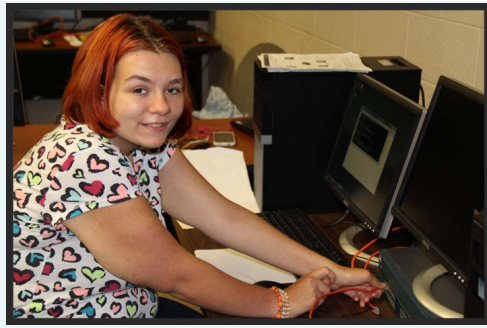


Heather Basham, daughter of Donna Dupont, is a senior at New Albany High school and participates in the Cosmetology program at Prosser.
