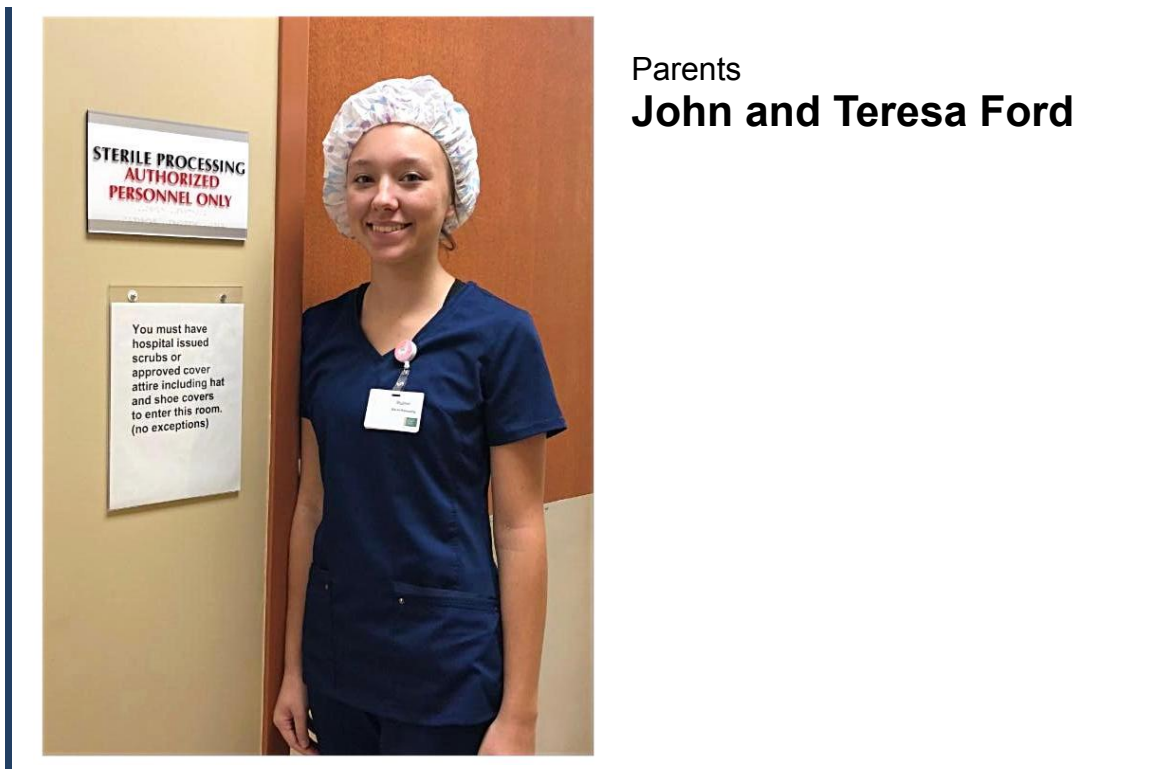

Jordan Ford's future career, Sterile Processing (making sure all supplies and equipment are ready for patient surgery), is essential to running a successful hospital, and she is already entering that field before she has finished high school. Currently, she is in her clinical setting at Harrison County Hospital, an affiliate of Norton Healthcare, three days a week. Jordan is working on earning the 400 hours needed to be eligible for her Sterile Processing Certification. By the time she finishes her senior year at Prosser, she will also earn up to 27 hours of dual credit with Ivy Tech. Besides keeping patients safe, Jordan volunteers at the Leavenworth Food Pantry and plays tennis for her school. She demonstrates leadership by being eligible for the Governor's Work Ethic PRIDE certificate and is on the Student Leadership Team. Jordan says her favorite thing about the CST program is knowing even though she is behind the scenes, she can still make a difference. She plans to pursue her degree in Surgical Technology after high school.
